

but deliver us from evil.


For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.

Gary J. Dorrien received his B.A. degree from Alma College, M.Div. from Union Theological Seminary, followed by an M.A. and Th.M. degrees from Princeton Theological Seminary and Ph.D. from Union Graduate School. He also has a D. Litt. degree from MacMurray College and D.D. from Trinity College. He is an Episcopal priest. Prior to his current position as Reinhold Niebuhr Professor of Social Ethics at Union Theological Seminary and Professor of Religion at Columbia University, Dorrien was on the faculty of Kalamazoo College for 18 years. He has served as president of the American Theological Society and has a record of involvement in social justice organizations. He is the author of 17 books. The trilogy, The Making of American Liberal Theology, published in 2001, 2003, and 2006, has been described by reviewers as the definitive work in the field. Recent books include Economy, Difference, Empire: Social Ethics for Social Justice (2010), Kantian Reason and Hegelian Spirit: The Idealistic Logic of Modern Theology (2012), and The Obama Question: A Progressive Perspective (2012).
