#### INVOKING THE HOLY

God is always with us, so this "invoking" or invitation to God, is really an invitation to our own selves to become aware of that constant presence.

One: God of wonder and amazement, we are in awe of the miracles around us. Help us to see you in all things, and keep us mindful and present. Amen.

#### PRAYER OF CONFESSION

Confession has a long tradition in Christian history. It is a way to name our own brokenness and failing, sometimes generically and sometimes quite specifically, as a means to cleanse our hearts as we move through the service.

One: Let us confess our brokenness before God and one another.

Merciful and forgiving God,

Many: Your world is filled with wonderful things.

Yet we become so immersed in our worries, becoming successful, and our problems, that we often fail to see the miracles around us.

Forgive us, and ground us in your presence.

#### SILENT PERSONAL CONFESSION

A brief moment to reflect on the prayer and your own heart and life. Silence is as important as noise in our dialogue with the divine.

#### **WORDS OF ASSURANCE**

As a people of Easter, there is always good news: when we die to our brokenness, we live again in hope.

One: God is merciful and patient. Receive the entire forgiveness of all your sins, and move through this world with eyes to see God in all things. Amen.

#### CHILDREN'S CELEBRATION

Children are very important to our church. Each service they come forward for a special lesson just for them. We want all children to know they are welcome everywhere in our sanctuary, even – especially – at the very front. We sing the song below as they come forward.



### **NEW TESTAMENT** Acts of the Apostles 3:1-10 (Good News Translation)

From Christmas through Easter we heard stories from the Gospel of Mark. We now continue through the New Testament to the Acts of the Apostles (a companion to the Gospel of Luke) and then various letters written to and from early church leaders. The Good News Translation of the Bible was first published in full in 1976 as an "everyday language" translation from the Hebrew, Aramaic, and Koine Greek of the Bible's original parts.

One day Peter and John went to the Temple at three o'clock in the afternoon, the hour for prayer. There at the Beautiful Gate, as it was called, was a man who had been lame all his life. Every day he was carried to the gate to beg for money from the people who were going into the Temple. When he saw Peter and John going in, he begged them to give him something. They looked straight at him, and Peter said, "Look at us!" So he looked at them, expecting to get something from them. But Peter said to him, "I have no money at all, but I give you what I have: in the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth I order you to get up and walk!" Then he took him by his right hand and helped him up. At once the man's feet and ankles became strong; he jumped up, stood on his feet, and started walking around. Then he went into the Temple with them, walking and jumping and praising God. The people there saw him walking and praising God, and when they recognized him as the beggar who had sat at the Beautiful Gate, they were all surprised and amazed at what had happened to him.

### Study: Study the reading and consider the background.

Peter and John offered healing in Jesus' name as their witness to Jesus' love for humanity. The people who were used to seeing the man asking for alms were filled with wonder and amazement at the sight of the lame man walking. There are many things about Jesus and about God's world that can fill us with wonder and amazement. Are we open to seeing?

# Read: Read the following daily readings to deepen your understanding of Sunday's text. After the reading, ask the follow-up questions.

Monday, Acts 4:1-22, Peter and John before the Council

Tuesday, Acts 4:23-31, The Believers Prayer for Boldness

Thursday, Acts 5:1-11, Ananias and Sapphira

Friday, Acts 5:12-16, The Apostles Heal Many

Saturday, Acts 5:17-42, The Apostles Are Persecuted

How did early believers back up their words with their actions?

# Connect: Connect in conversation with others. Discuss the following questions, or simply check in with "Highs" and "Lows."

What was a high point of your day? What was a low point?

Who in your community has a need that you could fill? Ask your pastor to connect you with people who could use the gifts you have to offer.

What fills you with wonder and amazement?

# <u>Do:</u> By acting on what we learn, we make God's word come alive. Do the following activity this week.

Keep two jars on a counter in your kitchen. Throughout the week, put a dollar in one jar for every time you catch yourself with a negative thought or action. Put a dollar in the other jar for every time you catch yourself with a positive thought or action. At the end of the week see which jar has more money. Donate all the money to a local charity.
