

## Theologian-in-Residence Weekend, February 23-24

Copies of the schedule for the weekend may be picked up from the table at the back of the sanctuary. Gary Dorrien, the 2013 Theologian in Residence at Ames United Church of Christ-Congregational, states in his book Soul In Society: The Making and Renewal of Social Christianity "A progressive American Christianity that refound its public voice could begin to engender the public debate over inequality that is needed to reclaim the hopes of poor, working-class, and middle-class people for security and justice". What does this mean for our congregation that wants to grow in numbers and be more involved in the community? Come February 23 & 24 to learn from Gary Dorrien, one of the foremost theologians of our time. Gary Dorrien is the Reinhold Niebuhr Professor of Social Ethics at Union Theological Seminary.
