Prayers of the People - Here people are invited to share their prayer concerns with one another. At the conclusion of the prayers, everyone prays together the following:

Those things, good Lord, that your servants have prayed for, give us grace to work for; and in the purpose of your love answer our prayers and fulfill our hopes for Jesus' sake. Amen.

Lord's Prayer

The Lord's Prayer comes from Matthew 6:9-13. Here is a traditional translation, which each group should pray together.

Our Father who art in heaven,

hallowed be thy name.

Thy kingdom come.

Thy will be done.

on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our debts,

as we forgive our debtors.

And lead us not into temptation,

but deliver us from evil.

For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.
