PASSING OF THE PEACE

Passing the Peace is an ancient Christian tradition in which we show we carry no weapons, only love.

CALL TO WORSHIP

A formal and mutual invitation to move into the worship experience.

One: The day breaks

Many: And God does not let us go.

One: The hour calls

Many: And God does not let us go.

One: The evening falls

Many: And God holds us fast.

One: Let us turn to God in worship Many: God, who never turns from us.

HYMN "Great Is Your Faithfulness" (see insert)

Singing is one way to connect to God through our bodies. We stand up, breathe deep, and let loose. And as Augustine wrote, "(S)he who sings, prays twice."

INVOKING THE HOLY

God is always with us, so this "invoking" or invitation to God, is really an invitation to our own selves to become aware of that constant presence.

Right side: You see our struggles,

You see our difficulties.

Left side: You see our possibilities,

You see our promise.

Right side: Connect the dots for us, O God.

Soften the hard spots with your blessing.

Left side: Call us in our wandering to hear you say our names.

Satisfy our longings as with loaves and fishes and manna from heaven.

One: For you are a good God, a God present in the scramble, and in the end,

you always, always have a blessing.

Many: For this and so much more,

we give you thanks, through Jesus Christ. Amen.

PRAYER OF CONFESSION

Confession has a long tradition in Christian history. It is a way to name our own brokenness and failing, sometimes generically and sometimes quite specifically, as a means to cleanse our hearts as we move through the service.

One: Let us confess our brokenness together.

Many: God of all mercy:

I confess that sin grips me and I cannot break free. The sins in my mind, on my lips, in my acts done or even ignored Stand between me and you.

My entire heart is not always yours.
My love of neighbor falls short.
In the name of Jesus, have mercy on me.

Grant me your renewing forgiveness.
Lead me on your paths of righteousness,
And I shall delight in you
And I shall follow you
Giving glory to your holy name.

Through Jesus Christ. Amen.

SILENT PERSONAL CONFESSION

A brief moment to reflect on the prayer and your own heart and life. Silence is as important as noise in our dialogue with the divine.

WORDS OF ASSURANCE

As a people of Easter, there is always good news: when we die to our brokenness, we live again in hope.


One: The God who gives, gives all. The God who loves, loves all. The God who forgives, forgives all.

All: By the grace of God, we are forgiven. Alleluia!

CHILDREN'S CELEBRATION WITH GIFT OF BIBLES

Children are very important to our church. Each service they come forward for a special lesson just for them. We want all children to know they are welcome everywhere in our sanctuary, even – especially – at the very front. We sing the song below as they come forward.



HEBREW BIBLE

Genesis 32:22-30 (Good News Translation)

We use "Hebrew Bible" instead of "Old Testament" out of respect for our Jewish sisters and brothers (it isn't old to them) and acknowledgement of the living voice still found in these ancient stories.

That same night Jacob got up, took his two wives, his two concubines, and his eleven children, and crossed the Jabbok River. After he had sent them across, he also sent across all that he owned, but he stayed behind, alone.

Then a man came and wrestled with him until just before daybreak. When the man saw that he was not winning the struggle, he hit Jacob on the hip, and it was thrown out of joint. The man said, "Let me go; daylight is coming."

"I won't, unless you bless me," Jacob answered.

"What is your name?" the man asked.

"Jacob," he answered.

The man said, "Your name will no longer be Jacob. You have struggled with God and with men, and you have won; so your name will be Israel."

Jacob said, "Now tell me your name."

But he answered, "Why do you want to know my name?" Then he blessed Jacob.

Jacob said, "I have seen God face-to-face, and I am still alive"; so he named the place Peniel.
